1	AIDPC	The American Indian Diabetes Prevention Center (AIDPC) , has several research, education, and tribal outreach projects designed to reduce the unjust health disparity of diabetes and its multiple co-morbidities in American Indian Nations. Experts from the Colleges of Public Health, Nursing, and Medicine are brought together in an interdisciplinary intellectual, research, and practice environment to reach the goal of a diabetes-free native world. Many key leadership positions are held by American Indian researchers including the Principal Investigator who is Oklahoma Choctaw. The AIDPC reaches all Oklahoma Indian Nations via their partnership with the Oklahoma Area Inter-tribal Health Board as well intensive collaborations with the Chickasaw Nation and the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma. 5	Bedlam Clinics	Bedlam – L provides coordinated and continuous care for uninsured adults with chronic illness in the Tulsa area. Open on Tuesdays from 1:30 p.m. until the last patient is seen, the clinic provides students with a service-learning experience in team-based, interdisciplinary, evidence-based patient care. Third year medical students in the OU School of Community Medicine practice the PCP (primary care provider) role under the guidance of OU faculty from various medical disciplines. Students from the University of Oklahoma Colleges of Nursing, Pharmacy and Social Work are also part of the patient care teams. 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6	CAIHR	Center for American Indian Health Research CAIHR is a multidisciplinary research organization and conducts health-related studies with American Indian groups. The focus of the research at CAIHR is to improve the health status of the American Indian population. CAIHR conducts epidemiological and clinical studies of health problems among these populations, with emphasis on diabetes and its many complications including heart disease, retinopathy, renal disease, leg vessel disease, and cerebral vascular disease. CAIHR also conducts studies focusing on health promotion and disease prevention. CAIHR has developed a productive relationship with American Indian tribes in Oklahoma including the Apache, Caddo, Comanche, Delaware, Fort Sill Apache, Kiowa, and the Wichita and Affiliated tribes located in southwestern Oklahoma, the Cherokee Nation in northeastern Oklahoma, and other tribes across the nation. 23	OU-SBIRT Collaborative	An interdisciplinary grant in the amount of about \$312,000 annually for three years for a grant total of almost \$1 million dollars. Titled the OU-SBIRT Collaborative (SBIRT: Screening, Brief Interventions, and Referral to Treatment), the purpose of the grant is to train students enrolled in nine different professional health care training programs within five different colleges on three OU campuses. SAMHSA approved training curricula will be embedded into existing courses within each discipline's training program. During the three years of the collaborative, over nineteen hundred students will be trained in the use of the SBIRT model.
