


STATEHOOD

Oklahoma became the <u>47th</u> state in the United States on <u>November 16, 1907</u>

Before Oklahoma became a state it was known as <u>Indian Territory</u>

Indian Removal Act beginning in 1830, ending in 1839



Over 60,000 Indians were forcibly relocated to Indian Territory.

Some 11,000 died.



16,000 Cherokees marched 1,000 miles 4,000 did not survive

From 1879 until 1918, over 10,000 Native American children from 140 tribes attended Carlisle. Only 158 graduated.






US VS OKLAHOMA RATES





This facility upholds the World Health Organization/UNICEF "Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding" published in a joint statement entitled: "Protecting, Promoting and Supporting Breastfeeding: The Special Role of Maternity Services"

Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding

Every facility providing maternity services and care for newborn infants should:

- 1. Have a written breastfeeding policy that is routinely communicated to all health care staff.
- 2. Train all health care staff in the skills necessary to be ement this policy.
- 3. Inform all pregnant women about the benefits and agement of breastfeeding.
- 4. Help mothers initiate breastfeeding within one hour of birth.
- 5. Show mothers how to breastfeed and how to maintain lactation even if they are separated from their infants.
- 6. Give infants no food or drink other than breastmilk, unless medically indicated.
- 7. Practice rooming-in -- mothers and infants to remain together 24 hours a day.
- 8. Encourage breastfeeding on demand.
- 9. Give no pacifiers or artificial nipples to breastfeeding infants.
- 10. Foster the establishment of breastfeeding support groups and refer mothers to them on discharge from the hospital or birth center.




The Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding form the basis of the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative, a worldwide breastfeeding quality improvement project created by the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

Baby-Friendly hospitals and birth centers also uphold the International Code of Marketing of Breast Milk Substitutes by offering parents support, education, and educational materials that promote the use of human milk rather than other infant food or drinks, and by refusing to accept or distribute free or subsidized supplies of breastmilk substitutes, nipples, and other feeding devices.





"How did you get the formula for your baby the first time your baby was given formula in the hospital?"










