A new report by the Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health summarizes findings about family-centered care for children with special health care needs. It highlights studies that look at aspects of family-centered care, such as family-provider partnerships, coordinated care, racial/ethnic and linguistic barriers, and culturally competent care.
