The 18th birthday of the Olmstead Decision



Eighteen Years ago the Supreme Court ruled a landmark case called Olmstead v. L.C.. This act stated that under the Americans with Disabilities Act, people with disabilities cannot be unnecessarily segregated and must receive services in the most integrated setting possible. Human Services for the aged and disabled are in danger as the DHS deals with its' new budget. If this continues the only options for many elderly and disabled will be to go into a nursing facility at 300% normal cost of home care services. For those who depend almost entirely on the Advantage Waiver, this would be detrimental to their way of life and their future. There are about 6000 people being served right now, and there are an additional 7500 who are waiting for services. Some waiting more than eleven years and are in desperately afraid that, with the budget cuts, might never receive the services. For more information see the following video here.
