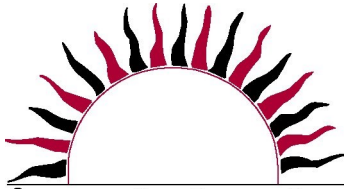
#ABLEtoSave Campaign Launches

The Association of University Centers on Disabilities (AUCD) opposes the nomination of Judge Brett Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court of the United States. Judge Kavanaugh has overruled multiple court orders that had given people with intellectual disabilities certain rights. The AUCD says that Judge Kavanaugh has failed to support the "critical principle of self-determination for people with intellectual disabilities and the importance of access to healthcare for millions of Americans with disabilities."
