Family Support Assistance Payment (FSAP) Applications Now Being Processed



FSAP applications are now being processed by **OKDDS**. This program is a cash payment of 250– 400 dollars a month to be used at a family's discretion. To be eligible for the payment, a family must have a child or children under 18 with developmental disabilities and a yearly income of no more that 45,000 dollars. Oklahoma Nutrition is for Everyone Project

From 2016-2018, five **AUCD** (Association of University Centers of Excellence) organizations from Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Tennessee, and Mississippi participated in the Nutrition is for Everyone (NIFE) project. In Oklahoma, the **Center for Learning and Leadership/ OK UCEDD** and academic and community partners developed and taught peer-led nutrition and health trainings and cooking classes for adults with I/DD and Spanish-speaking families who have children with disabilities. NIFE also provided nutrition education outreach in social media outlets such as Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest, as well as in radio and television. Over the past year, Oklahoma NIFE reached **106,651** people in its outreach efforts. The AUCD grant was funded by the Walmart Foundation.
