### **Oklahoma Primary Elections in June**



Oklahoma's primary elections will held on June 26th for state and national offices. The deadline to request an absentee ballot is June 20. Early voting will be held on June 21, 22, and 23. Run-off primary elections will be held on August 28. To vote in the Republican primary, you must be registered as a Republican. To receive Lifespan Respite vouchers, caregivers must have an income of 90,000 dollars or less and not receive respite services or payments from other programs. ### **Safety Equipment Grants for Individuals and Families**



**AutismOklahoma**'s project **Piece of Mind** offers individuals with autism or other neurodevelopmental conditions and their families grants for home safety equipment, such as alarms and GPS trackers. Grants decisions will be made based on severity of safety concerns, financial need, and available resources in the community. From May 31st, 2018, Oklahoma STABLE accounts became available to eligible Oklahomans with disabilities, allowing them to save and invest money without losing benefits from programs such as SSI and Medicaid.
