President Trump Signs Bill for Disaster Planning

President Trump signed the Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness and Advancing Innovation Act into law on June 24, which requires federal agencies to consider people with disabilities when planning for disasters such as tornadoes, hurricanes, and fires. The act calls for the creation of a national advisory committee for disaster planning for individuals with disabilities. The committee will be comprised of government officials, people with disabilities, and health care professionals and will review federal policies and make recommendations.
