Juneteenth

On June 19th, millions of Americans will be celebrating Juneteenth, a federally recognized holiday that celebrates the end of slavery in the United States. It was on this day in 1865, a full two years after the Emancipation Proclamation, that federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas to ensure all slaves were finally freed. <u>Tulsa is celebrating</u> with a three-day event June 15th-17th. <u>Oklahoma City's celebration</u> features an all-day festival on Saturday, May 17th, and <u>Norman will celebrate</u> with a community event in Reeves Park from 6-10pm on Monday, June 19th.

PBS Newshour Highlights Oklahomans with Disabilities and the Waitlist

PBS Newshour has been working with advocates across the state for months to discuss the needs of Oklahomans with intellectual and developmental disabilities for their series, Disability Reframed, including <u>Representative Ellyn Hefner</u> and her son, William, a self-advocate.
