Study Finds Oklahoma Leads the Nation in Long COVID

A recent study has found that 34% of adults in Oklahoma are experiencing Long COVID, the highest rate in the country. Dean of OU's Hudson College of Public Health Dr. Dale Bratzler says that "patients who are not vaccinated have a greater risk of getting COVID-19 long term symptoms." SoonerCare and SoonerSelect Information

Most SoonerCare members will get their health care services covered in a new way starting in April of this year – through health and dental plans under <u>a new program called SoonerSelect</u>. While most SoonerCare members will be required to pick a medical and dental plan, not everyone who qualifies for SoonerCare will be eligible for SoonerSelect.
