Flu Season is Here – Get Your Shot (or Mist) Today!

Fall and winter months bring color changes in the leaves, cooler temps, and the flu. If you haven't already received your flu shot, it's time to get one scheduled. [Use this locator](#) to schedule at a site near you. You can select specific flu vaccine options including an egg-free flu shot, the nasal spray option for those who are needle hesitant or anxious, and a higher dose option for people 65 years and older.

Social Security Administration Mails Information to Help Support Transition-Aged Supplemental Security Income Recipients

On September 27th, over 342,000 transition-aged youth between the ages of 14-17 year that receive SSI were mailed a notice from the Social Security Administration (SSA) and their adult representatives, sharing information on policy and resources that are useful in the transition to adulthood. Resources include information on ABLE accounts, work incentives, and redetermination policies for SSI once a recipient turns 18.
