#### September is Suicide Prevention and Awareness month

September is recognized as Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month, and Oklahoma offers numerous resources for those facing a mental health crisis. One such resource is <u>988</u>, a <u>three-digit hotline</u> connecting Oklahomans with trained behavioral health professionals, available around the clock. <u>NAMI Oklahoma</u>, a statewide network of families, members, and partners, is at the forefront of advocating for mental health. Additionally, the <u>Autism Foundation of Oklahoma</u> is also raising awareness and providing statistics and resources regarding suicide within the autism community.
