A YEAR IN REVIEW

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

- Developed and implemented a two-year longitudinal <u>curriculum plan</u>. Approved in Summer 2018 with implementation in Fall 2018 and beyond.
- Coordinated implementation of a new online didactic Introduction to Interprofessional Education course in D2L available to 958 learners from 29 academic programs
- Coordinated delivery of <u>All Professions Day</u> 2018-19, two didactic sessions to 958 learners from 29 academic programs (increased from 868 in 2017-18)
- Coordinated delivery of the <u>IPE Clinical</u>
 <u>Experience</u> at a local community-based agency, Good Shepherd Clinic, for 97 students from 15 academic programs (increased from 75 in 2017) with increased patient load average of 8 per night (increased from 2-3 per night in 2017)
- Created and implemented a pilot interprofessional <u>mini-course</u> available to small cohort of 14 learners

STUDENT-FACULTY COMMITTEE

- Newly formed in 2018 with student representation from each college, including the Graduate College
- Developed an additional administrative committee to foster student engagement in interprofessional activities ("IEPA Student-Faculty Committee")
- Two working projects/proposals: Pre-APD Open Houses, and a Student-Led ID/IPE clinic



FACULTY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

- Increased IPE participation to over 130 faculty and staff from across campus
- Developed, implemented, and coordinated the initiation of the Wisdom Family Foundation Interprofessional Education Research Seed Grants with the assistance of the IEPA Faculty Development Committee
- Delivered two faculty development educational sessions including guest speaker, Dr. David L. Gordon on the topic of "Unconscious Bias"
- Implemented and awarded the first IEPA
 Faculty Leader of the Year Award. The 2018 2019 honoree was Dr. Dale Bratzler.
