The committee is currently drafting guidelines. Goals include:

- To encourage Interprofessional Educators and Practitioners Association (IEPA)
 Associates to routinely seek academic publication and presentation opportunities related to their involvement in interprofessional education (IPE) programming.
- To stimulate discussion regarding guidelines/procedures for interdisciplinary/ interprofessional collaborative research to support understanding of authorship, expectations, responsibilities and accountability.

Research-in-Progress

- 2017-2018 study "OUHSC interprofessional Education and Practice Collaborative."
 - The purpose of the study is to explore health care professions students' perceptions about the delivery of care (e.g., types of providers involved in patient care; relationships between professionals; communication between health professions; students' attitudes towards teamwork and readiness for interprofessional learning.
- 2018-2019 study ""OUHSC Interprofessional Education 2018-19."
 - O The purpose of this study is to use a validated survey instrument (Interprofessional Assessment Scale, IPAS) to establish a baseline assessment of perceptions and attitudes toward interprofessional collaborative practice among health professional students across an early year of their curricula.
- Secondary Analysis Working Team.
 - A wealth of qualitative data has been gathered from EPIC program participants since 2013. This working team is evaluating data for evaluation of programmatic outcomes.
