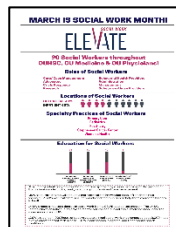

## IEPA Committee Updates

*The Interprofessional Educators & Practitioners Association (IEPA) welcomes faculty from all programs to participate in the planning and delivery of campus-wide interdisciplinary programming through service on our committees.*

### IEPA Executive Council

- Last met 1/30/19. Next meeting 3/27/19.
- Due to weather and schedule conflicts, the February meeting was postponed.
- Executive Council members are asked to review the IEPA Executive Council Mid-Term Retreat report by 3/15/19. Copy will be released in the next newsletter.

### Curriculum Committee

- Last met 3/11/19. Next meeting 3/25/19.
- Group discussed opportunities to engage learners at the Tulsa campus. Suggestions included hosting a local APD at the Tulsa campus, sharing the Summer Institute programming, and ensuring same learning objectives are maintained in any expanded programming.
- No update was provided regarding the simulation component.
- Synthesis: Work continues on evaluation of a 'capstone' culminating experience. Marsha Beatty and Megan Peters have joined this work team. Areas of consideration include utilizing programming already in place such as current capstone or research activity.
- Clinical: Team is considering opportunities for expansion of programming at Good Shepherd Clinic, including exploration of a possible continuity clinic. Faculty/staff participating in the 2018-2019 IPE Clinical Experience are asked to respond to a doodle-poll to schedule a debrief in the coming weeks.

## Interprofessional Medical Mission Trip

Students from the OUHSC Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology programs joined Pharmacy students from the University of Florida to partner with Asociación Yucateca ProDeficiente Auditivo (AYPRODA) in Merida, Mexico to provide hearing healthcare to the Yucatán population.

OUHSC students were sponsored by Dr. Christi Barbee, Chair of the IEPA Faculty Development Committee. The group provided over 50 hearing aids, 3,000 hearing aid batteries, as well as other medications and supplies donated throughout the year.

By participating in this extracurricular service opportunity, our students became more culturally competent by working with the Mayan and the Mexican cultures while in the country.

### Education for Social Workers



BSW undergraduate degree lays the foundation by providing a broad overview of the profession that includes social policy, family relations, group work and care management.

MSW graduate degree will acquire a more specialized knowledge base, often choosing a specialty. MSW's work with families, individuals and communities to help them overcome barriers to health.

LMSW's need a master's degree in social work from a CSWE-accredited program. The LMSW license allows an individual to provide master's-level, non-clinical social work services under the supervision of an LCSW.

LCSW's requires 4,000 hours of post-graduate clinical social work experience, at least 3,000 must involve direct contact with clients. LCSW's can assess, diagnose, and treat mental health conditions.
